Vellum, $12\frac{3}{4} \times 9\frac{1}{2}$ in., 156 ff, single and double columns, 30 lines to a page. Written in two xvcent. clear and upright hands (changing at 152^b), with later additions; headings in red, capitals alternately in red and blue, small blue initials flourished in red, line fillings of red and blue serrated strips. The principal pages have large initials in colour on gold ground, with filling and partial borders of English foliage and featherwork. On f. 9 a miniature of the Annunciation, with a solid border of naturalistic flowers, birds, strawberries, insects, etc. fly leaf. 1⁶ 2⁸ (+4 leaves inserted after 1) 3-11⁸ 12⁶ (1 cancelled) 13-19⁸ 20⁴; catchwords xviii cent. calf, blind tooled
