 Nunc est Laevini Torrentij. The latter was admitted canon of St Peter's, Liege in 1563  
 (E. Poncelet, Inventaire des Chartes de St. P. à Liege, Brussels 1906, p. lxxxviii). Later press-  
 marks Y. 1 <sup>(on f. 1)</sup> and N. 14 <sup>(on f. 14)</sup> the latter with initials G.D.J. <sup>(on ff. 3 and 4)</sup> and 17. Subsequently  
 belonged to Richard Heber, and was lot 1170 in his sale 17 Feb. 1836, <sup>sold for £3.53. to Payne and Foss</sup> ~~whence it passed~~  
 for Sir Thomas Phillipps. Phillipps MS 8453, and was lot 863 in the sale at  
 Sotheby's 27 April 1903, sold for <sup>£1. 15. 6</sup> ~~1. 15. 6~~ of B. Dobell, ~~20 Jan 1904~~ of whom it was  
 purchased 30 Jan. 1904.
